Almost 1,000 publicly funded research institutions




Research expenditures: 84 bn euros = 2.89% GDP

 (88 public, 12 private, 11 catholic)
- ► 56 art and music colleges

 (46 public, 2 private, 8 catholic)
- 225 universities of applied sciences
 (105 public, 99 private, 21 catholic)
- No tuition fees at public universities (few exceptions). PhD is usually "paid"


